## Key Vocabulary

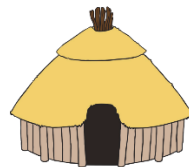
House	A building where humans live.

Modern	Something that has recently been made and has not existed before.



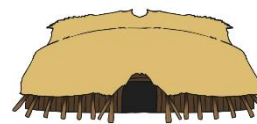
