


## Key Instant Recall Facts

# I know the composition of the numbers 11 to 19 as '10 and a bit'



11 = 10 + 1

12 = 10 + 2

13 = 10 + 3

14 = 10 + 4

15 = 10 + 5

16 = 10 + 6

17 = 10 + 7

18 = 10 + 8

19 = 10 + 9

#### Top Tips

Key Vocabulary

16 is made of 10 and 6.

10 and 2 make 12.

15 is one ten and five ones.

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact of the day.

#### Numberblocks

Watch Numberblocks episodes from Series 3 and 4 in which the 'teen' numbers demonstrate how they split into parts, revealing their 'ten and a bit' structure.

#### Silly counting

To support the children in understanding the composition of the numbers 11–19, you could count aloud in different ways; for example, after counting to 19 in the usual way by saying, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, etc.... you could count by saying, eight, nine, one-ten, one-ten-one, one-ten-two, one-ten-three, etc.
