Adjective Bank with “I am”

Remember there are two different spellings for some of these adjectives, when you use them with “**Estoy**” (I am).

Estoy – I am

feliz – happy

triste - sad

confundido / **confundida** - confused

cansado / **cansada** – tired

gracioso / **graciosa** – (feeling) silly

fenomenal – (feeling) great

Adjective Bank with “tengo”

Remember that in Spanish we do not always use “I am” (estoy) to explain how we are feeling, we also use “**tengo**”. Take a look here.

Tengo hambre. - I am hungry.

Tengo sed. – I am thirsty.

Tengo calor. - I feel hot.

Tengo frío. - I feel cold.

Grammar Bank

To describe feelings in Spanish, we need to make sure that the adjective used matches the person. The spelling can change for a male or a female person. Watch out!

Grammar Bank

The personal pronouns (singular) in Spanish are:

Yo – I

Tú - You

Él – he

Ella – she

Tú te llamas / tú tienes ... años / tú vives en

You are called /you are...years old / you live in

Él se llama / él tiene...años / él vive en

He is called / he is... years old / he lives in

Ella se llama / ella tiene...años / ella vive en

She is called / she is... years old / she lives in

Can you see how the verb changes depending on the pronoun? That’s why in Spanish, you don’t need to use the pronouns.
